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# Hearing Aid Dispensers Practice Committee Meeting Minutes February 8, 2018 Sacramento, CA 95815

2. Public Comment for Items not on the Agenda

There were no comments from Public/Outside Agencies/Associations.

3. Discussion and Possible Recommendations to Full Board Regarding California Code of Regulations 1399.119 – Direct Supervision (Hearing Aid Dispenser Trainees)

The Committee discussed and received input from the audience regarding the level of supervision hearing aid dispenser trainees (HT) receive. The Committee was informed that the supervision of HT's is not as detailed in regulation as the supervision of Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (SLPA) is in

regulation. The Committee was advised that the current HT regulations were implemented in 1986. The Committee talked about the supervision of HT's from a consumer protection view and agrees that there needs to be better oversite. Concerns of the Committee are that fifty percent of candidates fail the practical examination, HT's hired to work independently at locations without a licensed HAD or DAU on site, and the requirements of an HT supervisor. The Committee recommends that HT's received 100% supervision during the taking of ear mold impressions, inspection of the ear, and performing an audiogram when the safety of a consumer can be at risk. Mr. Sanchez requested that the Committee review Business and Professions Codes 1399.116 through 1399.119 and give staff feedback on any language that the Committee would like to see updated.
